SUBJECT: Command Inspection Program (CIP) Policy

1. References:

- a. AR 1-201, Army Inspection Policy
- b. USAREUR Regulation 1-201, USAREUR Organizational Inspection Program

2. I place maximum emphasis on my Command Inspection Program (CIP) to measure progress and reinforce the goals and standards established for this command. I see it as a program that provides me feedback on mission capabilities and quality of life issues in the community. These inspections provide me with a comprehensive tool to evaluate mission capabilities and readiness, effectiveness of established procedures and management practices.

3. The importance of the CIP is to help emphasize teaching, coaching and assisting inspected activities meet the critical functions and quality of life initiatives identified by the command. I allocate resources and make recommendations on inspected areas. Careful consideration is given to areas highlighted by previous inspections, at commanders' conferences and in the community.

4. Inspected units are NATO Support Activity (NSA), 254th Base Support Battalion (BSB) and 80th Area Support Group, Headquarters and Headquarters Company (HHC).

5. Each of the above units will be inspected annually. Staff Assistance Visits will be conducted quarterly. New Commander Inspections will be performed within the first 30 days after assuming command.

6. Under my direction, the Deputy to the Commander (or whomever I designate) leads the inspections, and S2/S3, Training Division, administers the program. The proponent of this policy is S2/S3.
