MEMORANDUM FOR SEE DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: Suspension/Revocation of Military Drivers Licenses (OF 346) and POV Installation Driving Privileges

1. Reference AR 190-5, Motor Vehicle Traffic Supervision, 8 Jul 88.
2. Operating a privately owned vehicle (POV) on U.S. operated military facilities is a privilege conditioned upon the operator's compliance with laws, regulations, and good driving practices. Noncompliance or abuse of this privilege may result in its suspension or revocation. In some cases, suspension or revocation of installation driving privileges is mandatory under AR 190-5 (i.e. driving while intoxicated).
3. This policy applies to all U.S. military members, State Department employees, Department of the Army civilian employees, other U.S. Government employees, family members, and individuals (military or civilian, or non-DOD affiliated) who operate a Government vehicle (owned or leased) or a privately owned vehicle (POV) on and off U.S. operated military facilities in Belgium.
4. Upon notification of a traffic offense substantiated by competent evidence (i.e. Military Police report, civilian authority police report), the 80th ASG (NSSG) Commander may:
 - a. Assess negative traffic points IAW AR 190-5, Chapter 5, Table 5-2.
 - b. Suspend the individual's military driver's license for up to one year.
 - c. Suspend the individual's POV driving privileges on U.S. operated military facilities in Europe.
 - d. Notify the Unit Commander, 80th ASG (NSSG) Provost Marshal Office, and IHSC Provost Marshal Office of the offense and actions taken.
5. AR 190-5 requires the immediate suspension of overseas command POV driving privileges when the driver:
 - a. Refused to take or complete a lawfully requested chemical test to determine contents of alcohol or other drugs; or

b. Operated a motor vehicle with a blood alcohol content (BAC) of 0.10 percent or higher, or violates host nation law (a breath analyzer test result of 0.5 gr/l (0.22 mg/l of exhaled air) or higher in Belgium); or

c. Is reported as apprehended or arrested for intoxicated driving in an official report document.

6. Upon conviction for drunk driving or driving while intoxicated, upon refusal to take or complete a required breath analyzer test, or upon an administrative determination of drunk driving, the Commander, 80th ASG (NSSG), will:

a. Revoke the individual's military driver's license (OF 346).

b. Suspend the individual's installation driving privileges for U.S. operated installations within Europe for one year.

c. Notify the Unit Commander, 80th ASG (NSSG), Civilian Misconduct Action Authority, S2/S3, Provost Marshal Office, and IHSC Provost Marshal Office of the offense and actions taken.

d. Notify the appropriate issuing state driver licensing authority.

7. The Director of Logistics (DOL) is hereby delegated the authority to take these administrative actions. Appeals may be submitted within 10 days of the notification of action through the DOL, 80th ASG (NSSG).
